This 33-week (990 hour) program takes students with little or no previous experience in the automotive repair trade and supplies them with the necessary skills to seek employment in this industry as an apprentice technician. The courses introduce the students to many aspects of servicing and repair in the automotive repair trade with a focus on developing practical skills. Graduates of this program will receive 450 hours towards Automotive Service Technician Year 1 (AST1) certification and the opportunity to write the AST1 Certification of Qualification exam.

Credentials Received

Graduates of this program will receive 450 hours towards Automotive Service Technician Year 1 (AST 1) certification and the opportunity to write the AST 1 Certificate of Qualification exam. The AST 1 Certificate of Qualification and 1590 workplace hours are required to proceed into AST 2.

Secondary school students will earn 32 elective credits (8 Grade 12 courses) towards graduation.

Physical Requirements

- Activities require lifting and carrying tools, supplies and equipment weighing up to 15 kg
- Lift, carry, hold and operate hand, air and power tools from floor to above shoulders
- Stand on concrete and asphalt, dirt, rock, wood, etc. for extended periods of time.
- Bend, stoop, kneel, crawl to perform tasks
- Work in confined spaces
- Work in both indoor and outdoor venues, through all seasonal challenges
- Push/pull and carry electrical construction materials and troubleshooting equipment

Recommendations for Success

- Good general health and respiratory condition
- Strength and stamina to handle physical work
- Ability to tolerate loud noise and vibration from riveting tools
- · Good manual dexterity
- Balance and coordination to walk on uneven ground for up to 8 hours per day
- Good hand-eye coordination
- Satisfactory eyesight, line, form and depth perception
- Willing to work in team and individual environments
